Call for Papers

The Lycoming College Humanities Research Center is seeking submissions from currently enrolled undergraduate students for our annual Undergraduate Humanities Research Conference. The conference is a one-day, in-person event hosted Saturday, April 5, 2025, on the Lycoming College campus. Submissions for consideration should feature advanced undergraduate research within humanities and related disciplines: history, literature, philosophy, art history, modern & classical languages, religious studies, interdisciplinary humanistic studies, digital humanities, and social sciences with humanistic emphasis.

The conference is free and open to the public. There will be awards for individual papers of excellence, and presenters will be invited to submit their research for subsequent consideration of publication in the *Mid-Atlantic Humanities Review: A Journal of Undergraduate Research* (www.lycoming.edu/mhr).

To be considered for conference participation, please submit your name, institution, email address, faculty research supervisor, paper title, and an abstract (200-300 words) via email to HRC@lycoming.edu by February 3, 2025. Abstracts may feature works in progress, but they should detail strong argumentative trajectories and research parameters indicative of advanced undergraduate work. Advanced work in translation is also welcome. Abstracts will be reviewed and acceptances confirmed by February 26, 2025. Conference presentations of 15 minutes should feature complete or nearly complete research. Digital supplements to presentations are welcome but not necessary.
